### Congratulations!

On Tuesday (9<sup>th</sup> Nov) Adam Bamber, our parish seminarian, received the ministry of Acolyte at Oscott College. Bishop Mark Davies, in his homily, told the seminarians how a priest during the fire at Notre Dame Cathedral in April 2019 put his life at risk. The priest went into the burning church not to save a rare statue or unique piece of artwork but to retrieve the Blessed Sacrament from the Tabernacle. The Bishop reminded the future priests that it is the Real Presence, Jesus Himself in the Holy Eucharist, who must be the source and summit of our lives, the treasure of our hearts. Let's continue to pray for Adam as he continues to discern God's call for him.

#### **NIGHT FEVER!**

Night Fever is the title given to a certain type of church event that has become quite popular in recent years. The title is a little obscure, apart from the fact that this activity usually takes place in the early evening, or at least after night fall. The Night Fever event is designed to be an evangelistic exercise, in that it includes inviting people to come into church from the street, to light a candle, to say a prayer, or just to sit down for a few moments—or for however long they might wish to stay. In the dimly lit church, there is exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, arrays of candles, and prayerful music being played. This spiritual setting and atmosphere is something that we, as Catholics, might take for granted, but for those who have rarely, or even never, entered a church, this experience can be very moving for them.
