# St. Mary's Parish Lenten Retreat 7th- 9th March 2022

The tradition of our parish Lenten retreat will resume this year. In 2019 we had the American catechist, evangelist and writer Barbara Reed-Mason. In 2020 we had Fr. Michael Doody, pastoral director at the Venerable English College in Rome. This year I've managed to persuade former barrister now Dominican Friar, Fr. Samuel Burke OP, based at St. Albert's University Chaplaincy, Edinburgh to lead this years retreat. The dates of the retreat will be 7<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> March on the theme of 'Hope' with more details to follow.
