

This week I was invited to Mrs Barlow's Class to talk about the vocation of a bishop and how he is called to be a shepherd and a teacher to those under his care. We looked at the various symbols a

bishop has, like the Crozier to show his pastoral care to those in his diocese. The Mitre that reminds us he has been chosen and anointed by God. His ring that is the symbol of his authority that comes from his communion with the Pope in Rome. The pupils then asked about my vocation as a priest and what flavour crisps and pizza I prefer! This is the joy of the young people in our parish.

On Wednesday I was with Year 6 to talk about the importance of the Bible and how God speaks to us through the sacred Scripture. I talked about how St. Antony of Egypt heard the Gospel story of the rich young man who wanted to follow Jesus, but couldn't because of his wealth. After hearing this St. Anthony sold all his material goods and went into the Egyptian desert to be with God and grow in holiness. I also told the pupils about Blessed Karl Leisner, who despite the impossible, trusted in the Word of God and was ordained a priest in Dachau.
